### Academic Schedules:

**Mrs. Hess's courses: Sr. High English:** In literature, we will begin Unit 2: Sound and Syntax. In grammar will take a quiz (pages 50-57) and a test (units 5-7 with a review of 1-4). **Jr. High English:** Students will be studying verb tenses, perfect and progressive. We will also study active/passive verbs and take quizzes covering related skills. **All English Students:** Students have received their spelling/vocabulary packets for next week. We will have a test on Friday. **Speech/Oral Communications:** Students completed their personal testimonies, and our focus is now group discussions and parliamentary procedure. (Completion of homework will assist the students greatly in preparing for all performances.) Students should keep their notebooks organized and up to date, too. Please review their daily note taking to evaluate the effort students are putting into note taking and engaging in each lesson.

**Mrs. Middlebrooke's courses: Jr. High Science** students will continue to learn about rocks and minerals. They will have a quiz over sections 3.3. **Biology** students will begin their study of anatomy and will focus on the skeletal system. They will have quizzes over sections 6.1-6.2 and 7.1-7.2. **Physics** students will focus on the properties of solids. They will have a quiz over sections 5.1-5.2. They will perform a lab observing the effects of shear deformation on solids.

**Mr. Huddleston's classes: World History** students will discuss the foundations of Rome and the development of the Roman Empire. Political, social, and religious developments will be discussed as we examine the contributions of Rome to Western Civilization. Quizzes will be given throughout the week.

**Mrs. Vickie's classes: Junior High Reading** The student will complete Unit 2: Choices. They will take Unit 2 Test and Unit 2 B Standardized Vocabulary Quiz. We will begin Unit 3: Heroes. The students will complete handouts and answer questions at the end of each story. We will continue discussing literary terms and recognizing their use in the stories. Students will continue to be given quizzes over each literary work they read.

**Mrs. Headley's classes: Math** students will continue in their studies of improper and proper fractions. We will begin addition and subtraction with fractions. Test 3 is on Thursday. **American History** students will wrap up Chapter 4: Daily Life in the Colonies with a Test on Tuesday. We will begin Chapter 6 and end the week with a quiz over sections I-III.

**Mr. Smith's classes: Pre-Algebra** students will have an introduction to Algebra and will learn how to translate and evaluate. We will review for a major test over chapters 1-3. Also, there will be quizzes over sections 3.5-3.7. **Algebra I** students will solve equations with variables on both sides and will graph functions. There will be a quiz over lessons 21-23 and a test through lesson 25. **Geometry** students prove angles equal and learn properties of right triangles. There will be quizzes over sections 2.9-2.13. **Precalculus** students will learn trigonometric identities and will evaluate functions. There will be quizzes over materials taught. **Junior High Bible** students will learn about the books of Ruth and I Samuel. There will be a test over lessons 10-12. **High School Bible** students will discuss Jesus' miracles in Capernaum and how He forgave sin. There will be a test over chapters 9-12. **All Bible students will have a verse memorization test on Friday - Matthew 27:15-19. We will work to memorize them in class. There should be little studying outside of class if students participate during memorization time well.**
